



High School / Jr. High Arrival and Drop-off

Morning drop-off / arrival for Mohawk Jr./Sr. High School is from 7:45am-8:00am. The tardy bell rings at 8:00 am, students arriving after 8:00 am will need to report to the office and sign in. The picture above shows the parking lot and traffic flow. The red line represents student drivers while the blue line represents parents or guardians dropping students off.

Both students and parents will enter the student parking lot from the West entrance (left side of picture) by the stop sign. Students will turn left into the first or second aisle of the parking lot and proceed along the back aisle to an open parking spot.

Parents/ guardians shall pull *as far forward as possible*. Students being dropped off must be prepared to depart promptly. If your student is not prepared to depart the vehicle promptly or you wish to park until the activity doors open at 7:45am, you must park in a designated parking spot. You may not park along the curb in the fire lane. You may drop off anywhere along the curb, but remain in single file, do not pass on the left. Students should exit the vehicle on the right hand side onto the sidewalk to avoid the flow of traffic. Once your student exits the vehicle, proceed to the exit. Follow instructions of duty personnel. Be courteous and polite, these procedures are in place to insure a safe and orderly arrival.

High School / Jr. High Afternoon Departure and Pick-up

Students are dismissed at 3:00pm. Teachers will exit the lot on the East exit. Students should use the North East exit onto the access lane exit along the football field fencing.

Parents will enter the student parking lot at the West entrance just like morning drop off. Parents arriving early must pull all the way up past the entrance. Pick up can occur along the full length of the curb; once your student has entered the vehicle proceed to the exit. Please be careful traffic is two-way in the aisle along the curb. There will be someone on duty to direct traffic. Please be patient and courteous. Safety first.
