Everything you need to know about 3th grade Math! (at least until the orders change again!)

Welcome to third grade math! I am excited that you and I will be spending the new school year together. This will be a busy, but fun year for all of us. Expect to learn a lot of new things, practice and improve on many of the skills you have already learned, become more responsible for the work you will need to do, and be able to feel a great deal of pride in your new accomplishments. We know this is not likely to be a normal year and we will probably be learning in ways that are new for all of us. I am confident, however, that if we are patient and work together, we will be successful in meeting our math goals.

In order for us to have a good year together, we will need to remember that each individual person in our class is important for our success. Each of us will need to do our very best at every task we are asked to do. We must respect each other, use good manners, and be responsible for our own behavior to allow everyone the best chance to learn.

The expectation, regardless of whether we are learning in school or remotely, is that the students will be responsible for their learning. Grades will be taken on both in school and remote learning activities. Parents should not need to be involved any more than normal once the students learn the procedures and routines.

We will be using the Remind App for all parent communication. There will be information coming with a code to join Remind.

We will be using Google Classroom every day, regardless of where we are learning. Using this platform will allow us to make an easier transition if/when we must learn from home. Students will need to login to our Google Classroom daily and complete a task. As long as we continue learning at school, the task will be short and can almost always be completed at school. It is important that students do these tasks, however, as they will sometimes count for points toward their math grade.

Students need to check their school email account every day. They will be notified by email when something new is posted in Google Classroom and I will communicate with them by email if we would happen to go to remote learning.

Students will have an accordion file folder containing the handouts for the topic we are studying. At the end of the topic, the handouts will be turned in for a grade. All handouts and homework papers should be kept in the accordion file folder until I ask for them to be turned in.

Like last year, students will be required to complete iReady lessons for a grade. The requirements are on a separate sheet, but can also be found on my web page. Students should complete teacher assigned lessons first, followed by iReady assigned lessons.
